ACT YOUR AGE, by William Davidson was the comedy in three acts presented by the senior class this year. The play was a big success with a large audience. The cast was as follows:






A number of other activities also were participated in by our group this year so, as you can see, we have been quite busy. Our thanks go to Mrs. Robinson for her help and understanding.








Gorham, Maine, High School Alumni Association of Boston

This is really the 51 st anniversary of the above group since the meetings have been going on since 1902. Some meetings were held before this but were to cease for a time to be resumed in 1902. The following material was taken from a short resumé of the origin and activities of this group written by William S. Townsend, Class of 1890, and one of the last charter members.

"The classes of 1889 and 1890 were always very friendly, and being the two largest classes at that time always cooperated in all their school activities.

On Dec. 31, 1888, the two classes were invited to meet at the home of Miss Angeline Weeks, Main Street, Gorham, to watch the coming of the new year of 1889. Nearly all the members of both classes accepted and a most pleasant and enjoyable evening was spent until 1:30 a.m.--a most unheard of hour for Gorham Village. During the evening it was planned to meet again Dec. 31, 1890, at the same place and time. At this meeting 5 boys of 1889 and two girls of 1890 were missing.

Again on Dec. 31, 1891, another reunion was called and only a few members were present. However, it was a most pleasant evening. A card from Miss Weeks inviting the two classes to meet with her at her home on Thursday evening, Dec. 29, 1892, is still in existence. At this meeting so few members were present that it was unanimously agreed to call off the reunion until some future date.

For some years after this time, the members of "'89 and '90" were widely scattered from the East to the West Coast, but as time passed on, it was found that the 'Clans' were gathering and settling in and around Boston. So a hunt for addresses began, and being so very successful, again a meeting was called to be held at the home of Miss Weeks at #1 Newman Way, Arlington. This was in 1902. From this time on meetings were arranged and held at the homes of different members, until 1905, when a special meeting was held at 17 Revere Street, Boston, the home of William S. Townsend at which time it was agreed that a club should be organized to be called "The Gorham High School Club of Boston," and the following officers were elected: President, Lester C. Roberts, '90; Secretary-Treasurer, Mrs. Maud Brackett Siewerts, '89. At this meeting it was also voted to have a public meeting with a banquet to attract new members. The place selected was "The Dunster Cafe," Dunster Street, Cambridge; the time, Feb. 2, 1906. The affair proved to be a great success and several new members joined our Club.

For a number of years, a banquet was served at these meetings, which were held at different hotels in Boston and Cambridge, but with banquets and long speeches, these formalities left little time for sociability, and about this time a change in the time of meeting was made to a more pleasant time of the year.

For some years following, the meetings were held at the homes of regular members, giving more time for renewing old friendships while light refreshments were served.

One very pleasant and convenient place of meeting was with Mr. & Mrs. Ernest Cressey at the rooms of the C. C. Harvey Piano Co. on Boylston Street, Boston. At one of these meetings the question of an outdoor meet was brought up and quickly voted to be held at 272 Grove Street, Melrose with Mr. and Mrs. Townsend on June 13, 1926. The day being a most beautiful and mild one, the occasion proved to be such a pleasing innovation that a number of meetings were held at different homes in most delightful places and surroundings.

After a few years of this arrangement, the present accommodations at the Huntington School were offered the 'Association' through the influence of the Principal, a graduate of Gorham High School, Charles Sampson. This last arrangement has proved to be a most convenient and satisfactory one, through the kindness and generosity of Mr. Wilkinson of the Huntington School.


In girls' sports we had both softball and basketball with a lot of enjoyment from both. We are going to miss some of our valuable players who are graduating this year.
