The success of the annual event goes to our excellent director, William T. Burgess, Jr. who showed a great deal of patience and hard work.












One of the outstanding achievements of the Chapter was the receiving of the Silver Emblem Award in the National Chapter Contest. Out of about 8,000 chapters in the whole organization, including the United States, Puerto Rico, and Hawaii, only 74 received silver or gold emblems. The award is based on: Supervised farm practices, cooperative activities, community services, leadership, earnings, and savings, membership, recreation and scholarship.

Another award received was the Gold Emblem award in State competition, the highest award given any chapter in the state.

The chapter is about \$300 richer this winter. That is approximately the profit made on the chapter project, the raising of one and one-half acres of squash, one thousand two hundred strawberry plants and about one-half acre of corn, beans, and potatoes.

Our F.F.A. attended the southern district meeting in Norway this winter where they had the opportunity to meet some of the boys in the other chapters in southern Maine.

Most of the contests were entered this winter, but the results haven't been received as yet. Several field trips were taken to dairy, co-op's and farms. Lipman's Poultry Co. was also visited.



New Aggie Building

Something new has been added to G.H.S. this year. It's the new Agriculture shop located about 150 feet to the rear and right of the main building. A few weeks after school opened it was ready to be occupied. Benches, machinery and tools were moved into the shop, and desks, books, and all of the other paraphernalia were moved into the class room.

The overall dimensions of the building are approximately 82 feet long and 30 feet wide. This makes room for a class room, toilet facilities, boiler room, and an ample shop.

The classroom is 15 feet by 21 feet which allows room for about 12 desks, Mr. Delano's desk, demonstration table, filing cabinet, bulletin box, and display cabinet. Another feature that has greatly improved the looks of the classroom is the new asphalt tile floor just installed.

Out in the shop, are, of course, all the tools and machinery that were in the old one and three new tools and supply cabinets. In one end of the shop is a door big enough so that tractors, hay rakes, etc. can be driven in and repaired. Some of the boys also made a movable lumber rack, painted and varnished cabinets, and shop and classroom equipment.

Another good feature about the new structure is the fact that it is at a desirable distance from the main building. This means that classes in the high school building are not disturbed by noise from the shop.



The installation of Officers was directed by Ellen Parsons, who was President last year. There are also plans for a Mothers' Tea, Spring Banquet, and a dance.



In the class "M" tournament we were met by our old foe, Greely, who managed to defeat us.


The J.V.'s had an excellent season this year, finished with ten wins and only two losses, and establishing the best J.V. record attained for several years.

On November 24, 1953, tryouts were held and a group was chosen to try out again. One week later the Varsity and Junior Varsity members were posted.



Many thanks to our coach and friend—Miss McGraw. Without her help and guidance, we couldn't have made it a success.









It is hoped that other schools in this vicinity will take an interest in soccer, since the only organized fall sport in the "Triple C" is track.


