An excellent Christmas program was presented by the choruses under the direction of Mrs. Bailey.


We started our vacation in fine style with a Christmas Semi-Formal sponsored by the Senior class. Judy Shaw was chosen queen from nine other Senior girls.



Eight violinists attended the Play Day for Strings at South Portland High School, December 3, and played in the concert that evening.


Eight members of the orchestra participated in the Western Maine Concert Festival at South Paris, January 28.

Although small in number, the Boys' Chorus made a good impression this year. The first time they appeared was at the Christmas Program.







Cross Country



Since no one is lost from graduation, prospects are excellent for next year. Much of the credit of our successes goes to our coach, Mr. Evans.


