
The Victory Dance sponsored by the Junior Class was a hailing success, with Judith Hall and Philip Washburn bearing royal crowns.

MADRIGALS


A very hard-working group of 22 students make up our Madrigals singers. They performed at the Annual Christmas Concert by supplying the background music for the Pageant.


Again the Gorham F.F.A. had a very successful year under the leadership of Mr. Delano.


CROSS COUNTRY


TRACK
