










The big four—Gary Miller, John Peterson, Mike Towle are in the lead at the halfway mark.




Despite an early tournament loss to Cape Elizabeth, this was still one of Gorham's better seasons. Overall teamwork, all-around hustle, and good sportsmanship led to the fine record. The season had many highlights, the most outstanding one being an 80-72 victory over Falmouth.

Marty Magnusson was the leading scorer for the Rams with 382 points or a 20.1 game average. Pete Hooper and Terry Hadlock were close with 15.9 and 13.3 game averages. A big factor in the team's success was the fine all-around play of Jim Good who averaged 4.9 points a game. Henry Bachelder, who also had a 4.9 game average, was a big defensive help to Coach Evan's squad.

The Rams outscored their opponents 1163 to 1071 in 19 games and averaged 61.2 points per game to the opponents average of 56.3.














