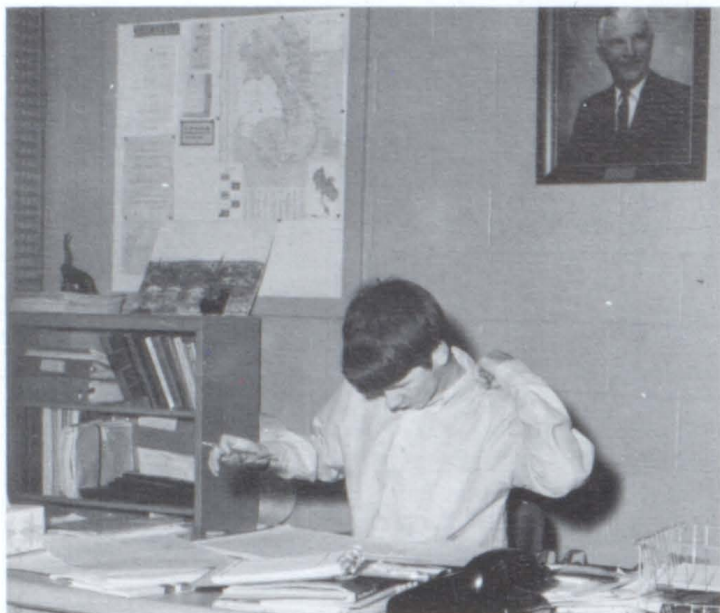

John Donne's words live . . .



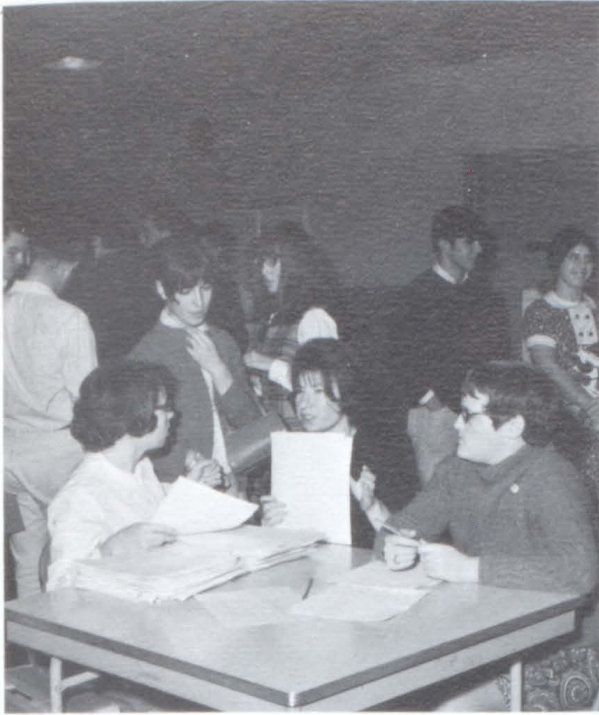
No man is an island entire of itself;

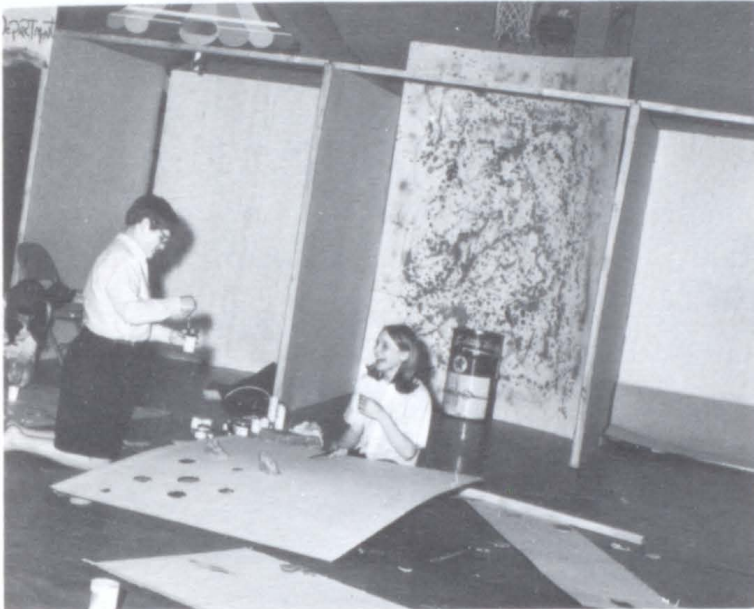
A.F.S. Club

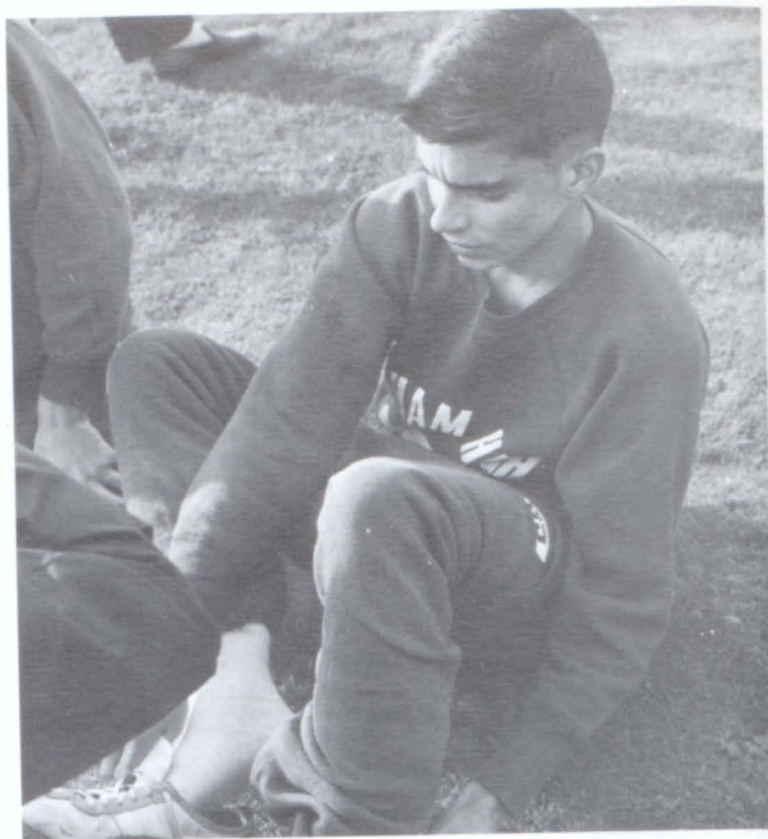

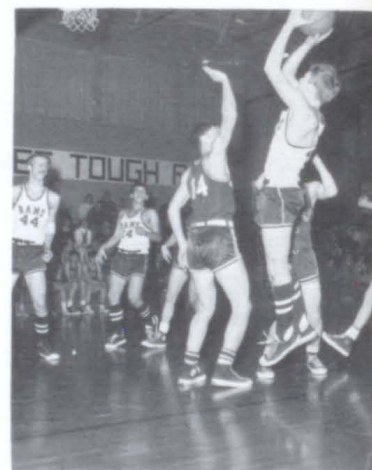

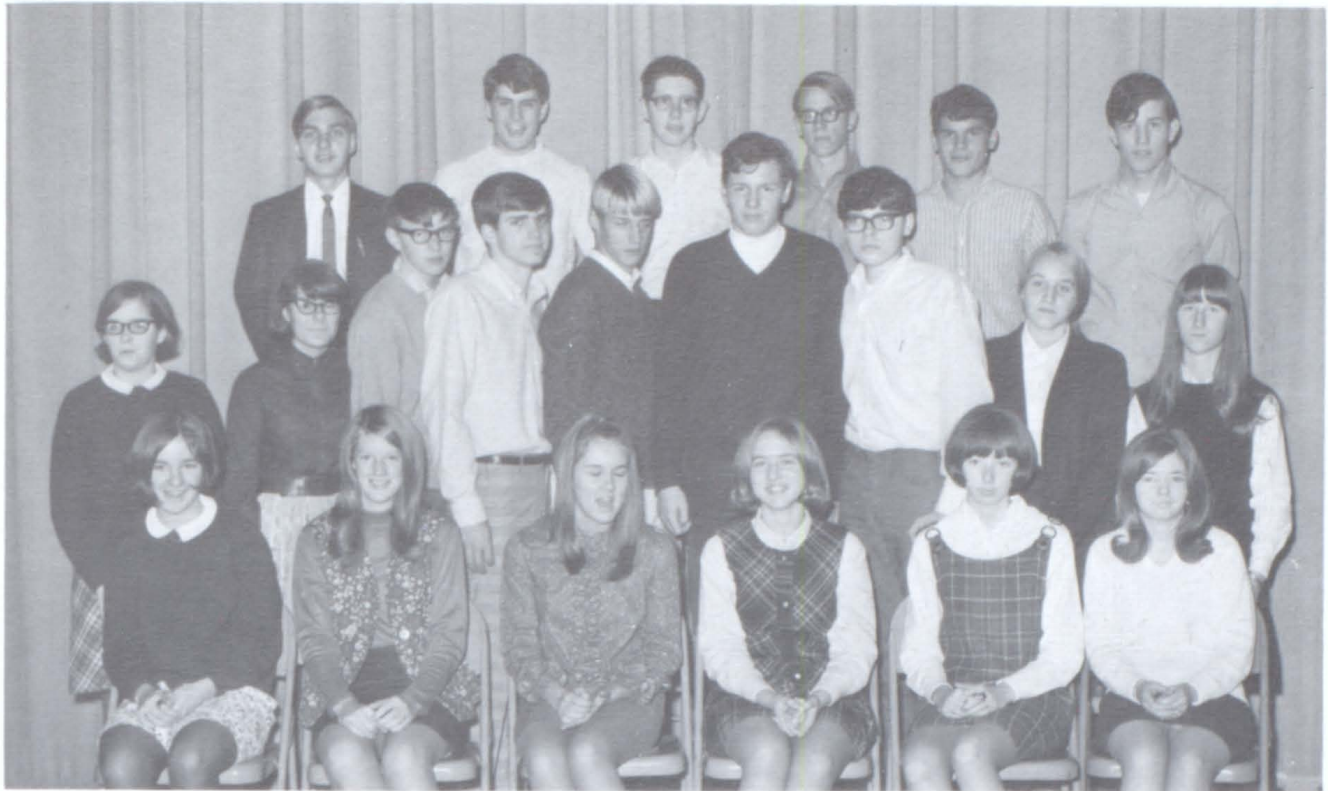
Sophomore Class
