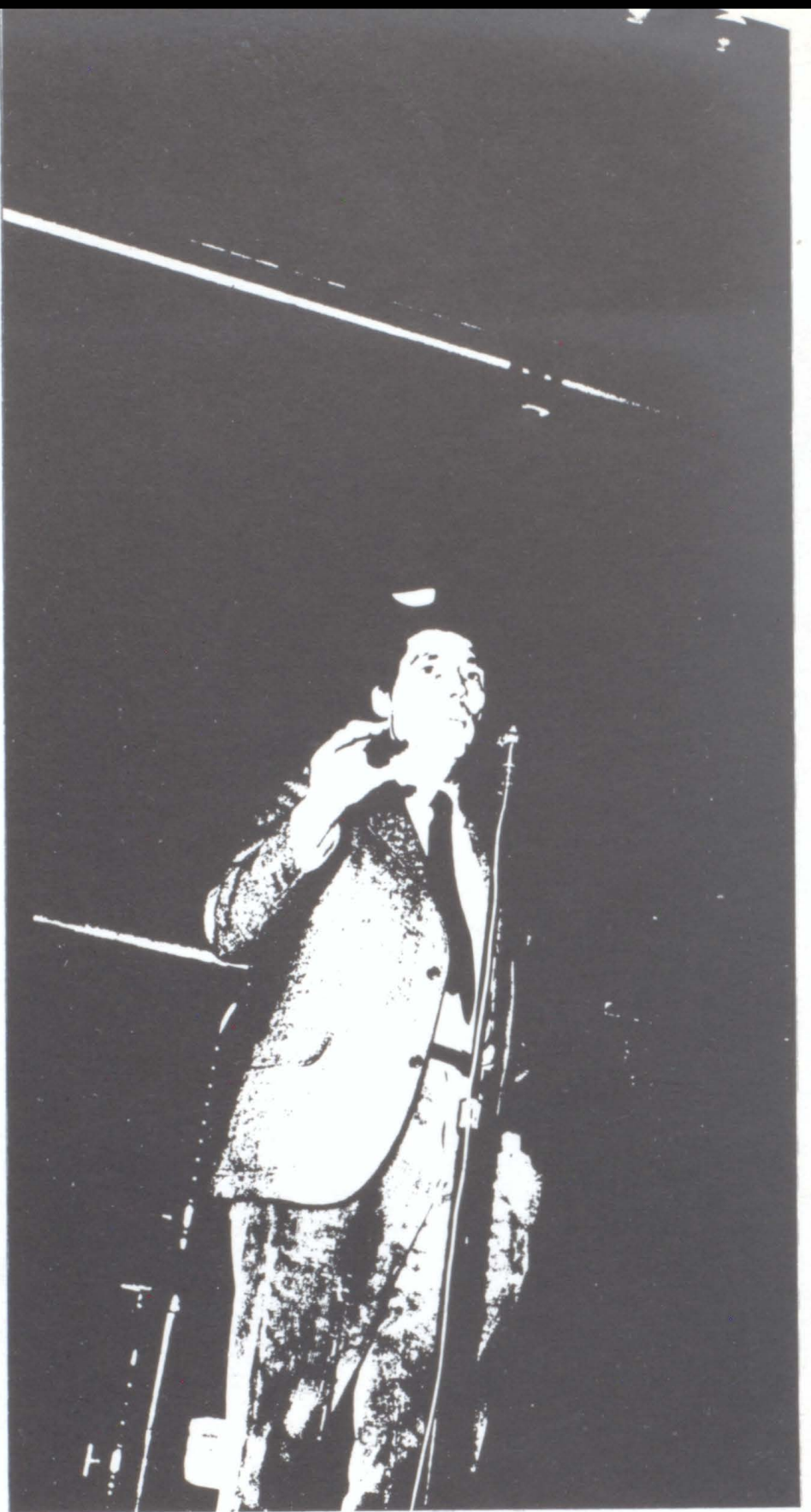

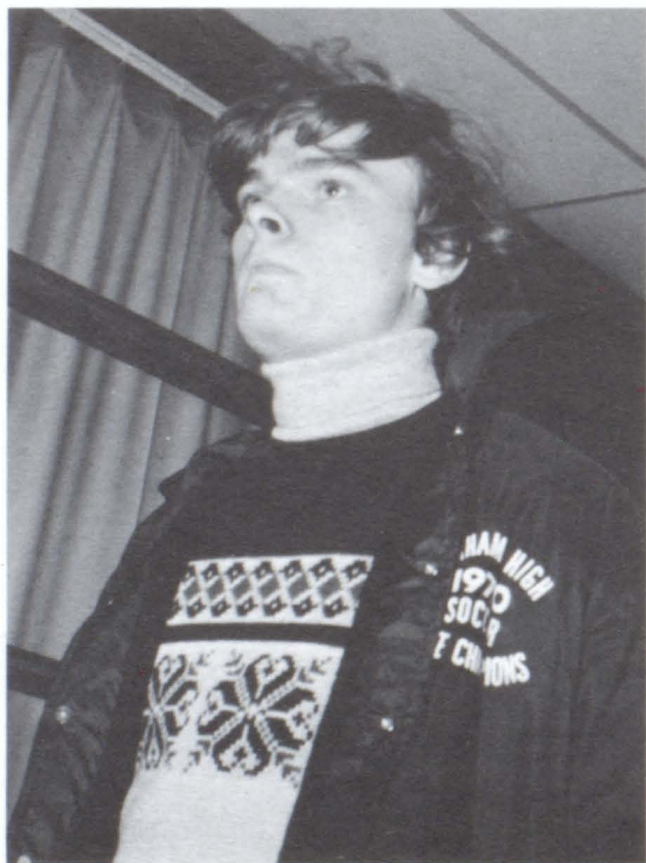

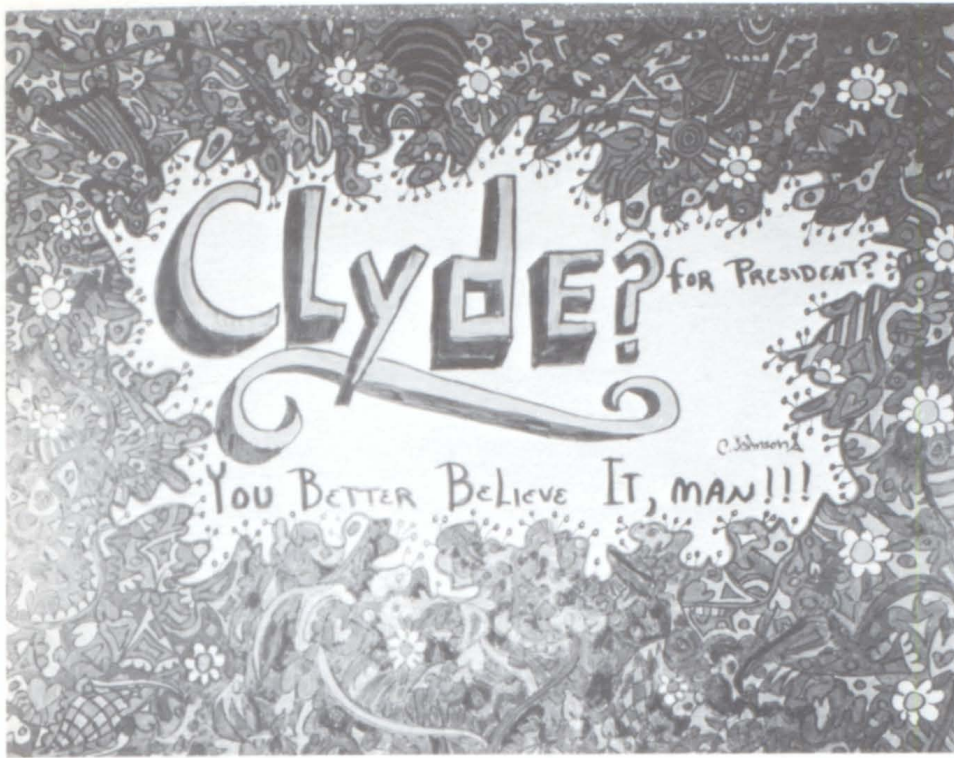


The end of the summer and the beginning of school. . . September 1970 arrives at Gorham High along with exciting ideas. . .

GHS students receive a few somber thoughts from a former member of the U.S. military complex. . . and from other sources too. . .



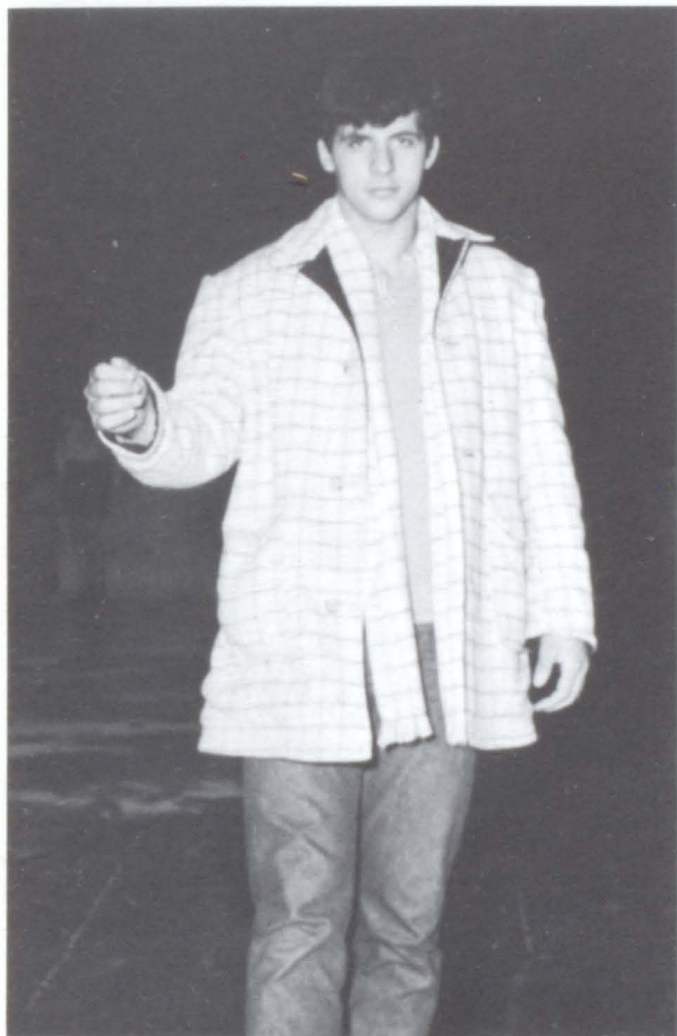
As the year progresses, we absorb a little culture. . .

A sure sign of spring around Gorham: the many rapt faces at the A.F.S. fair . . .



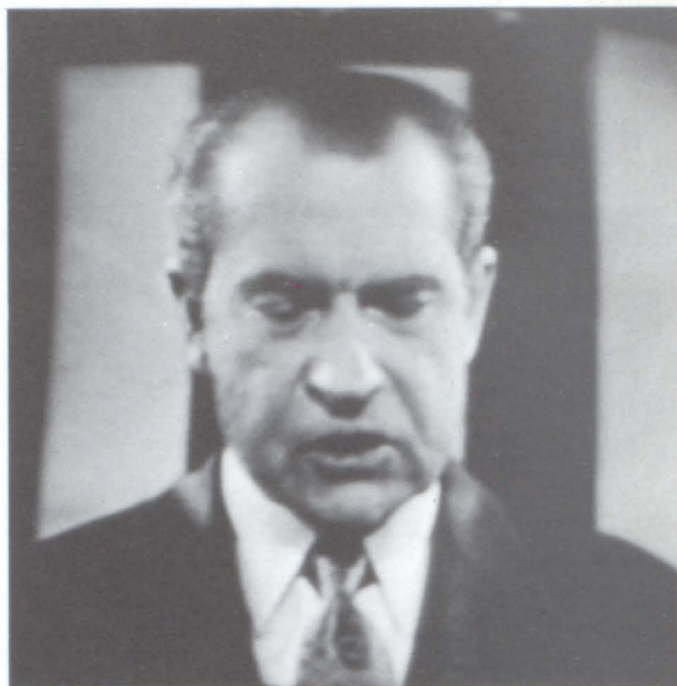

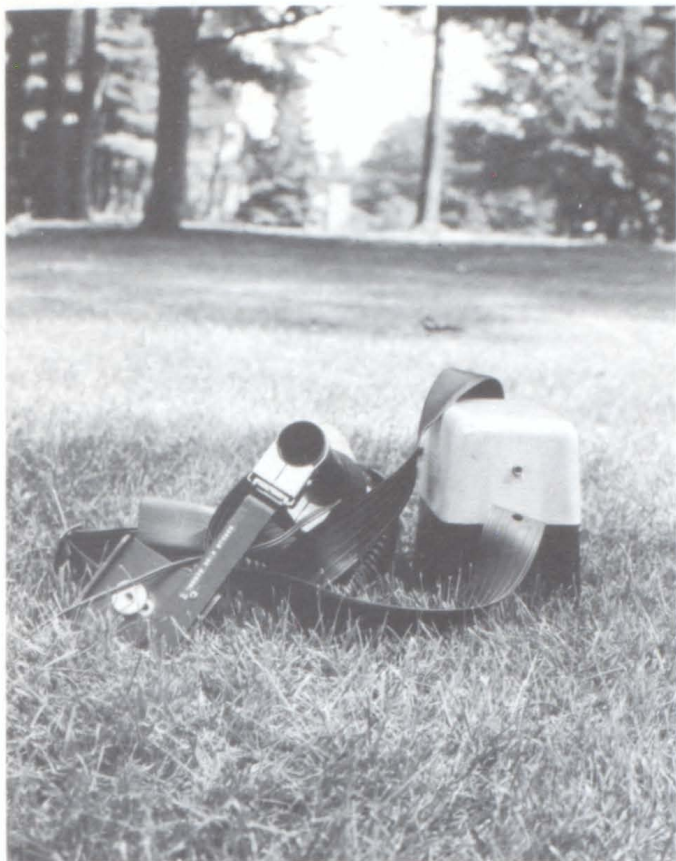

Yes. . . graduation. . . an ending and a beginning. . .

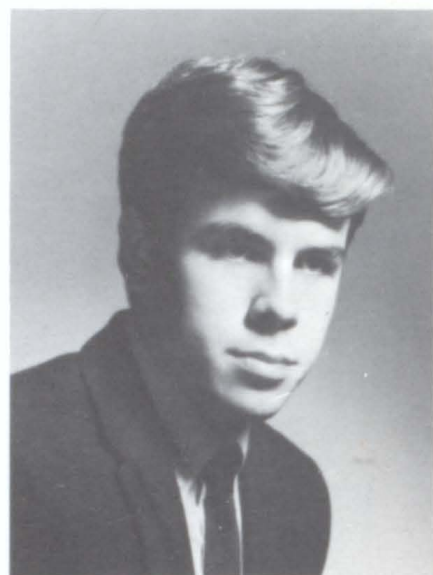

Last night's triumph was the 16th in 18 games for Coach Walt Ridlon's Gorham cluster.



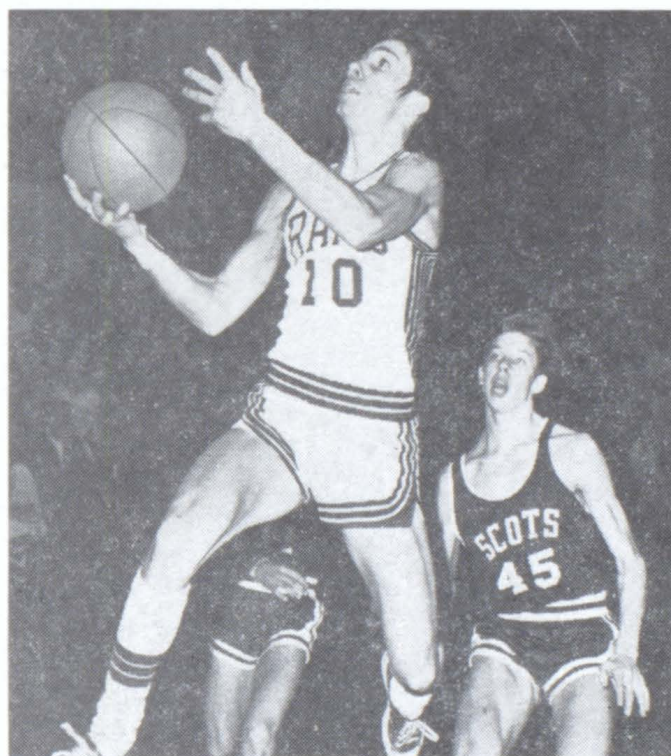
