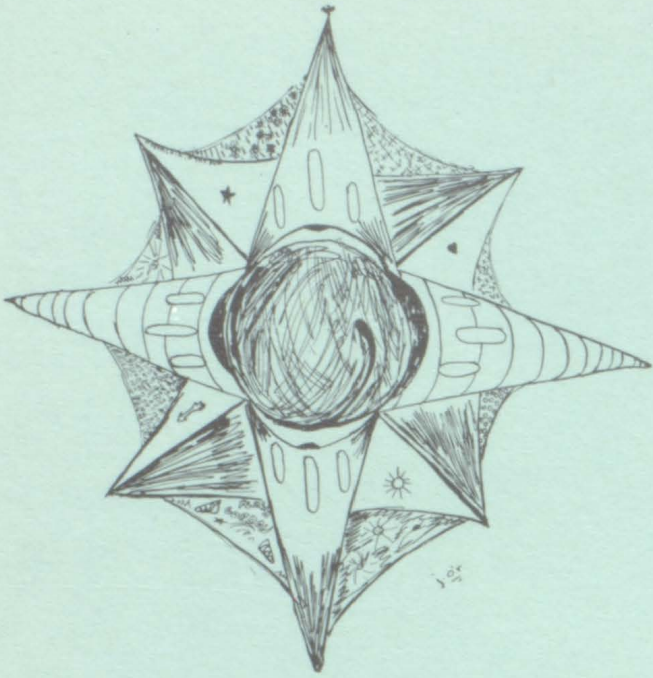


Sunset — Fort Hill

 And all the mornings leaning to our choice.*

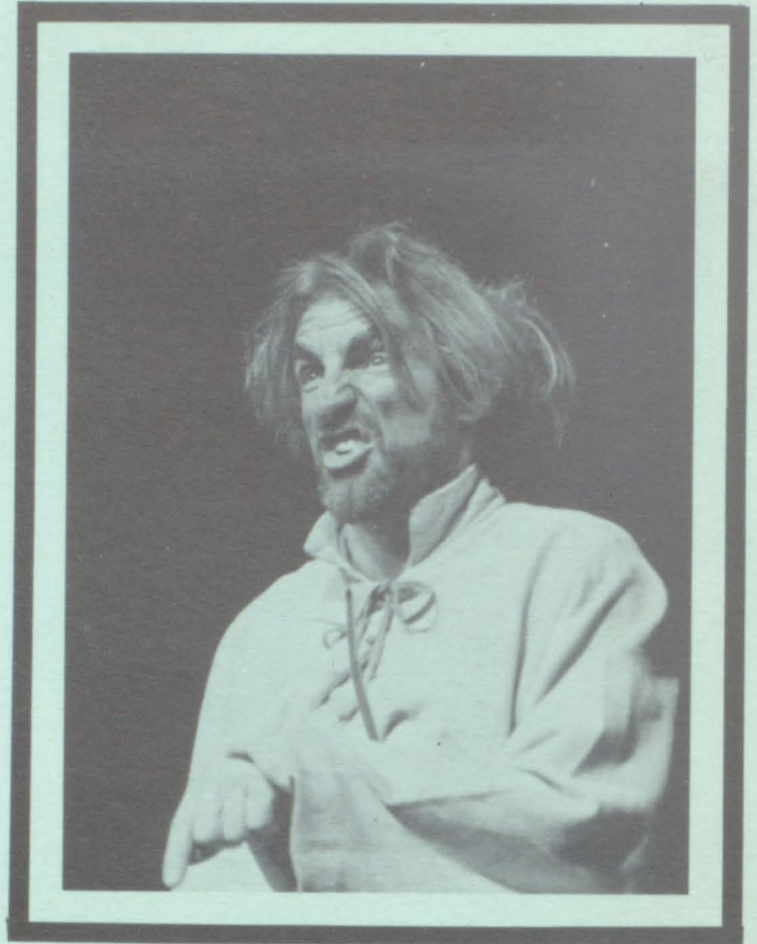

CLUBS AND ORGANIZATIONS



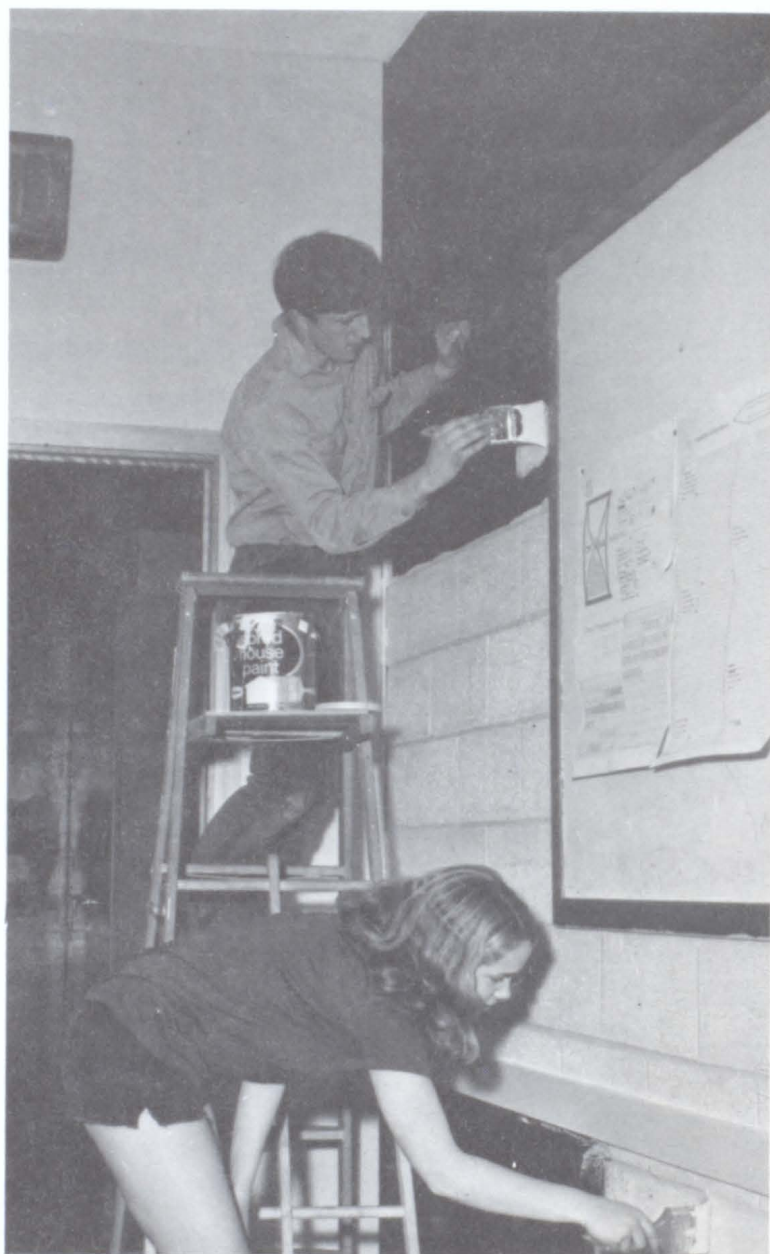

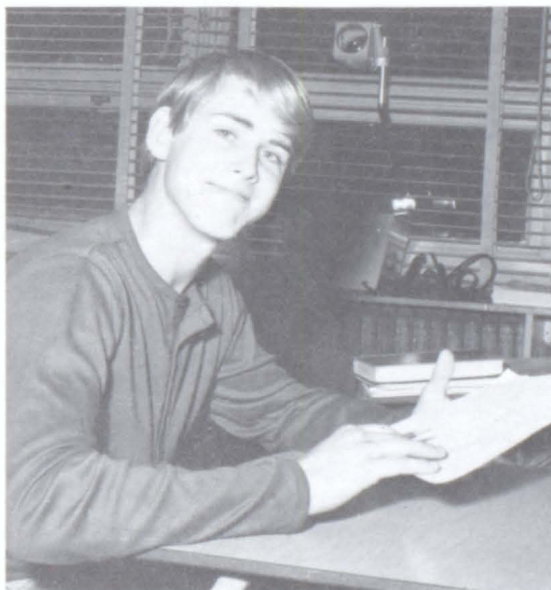

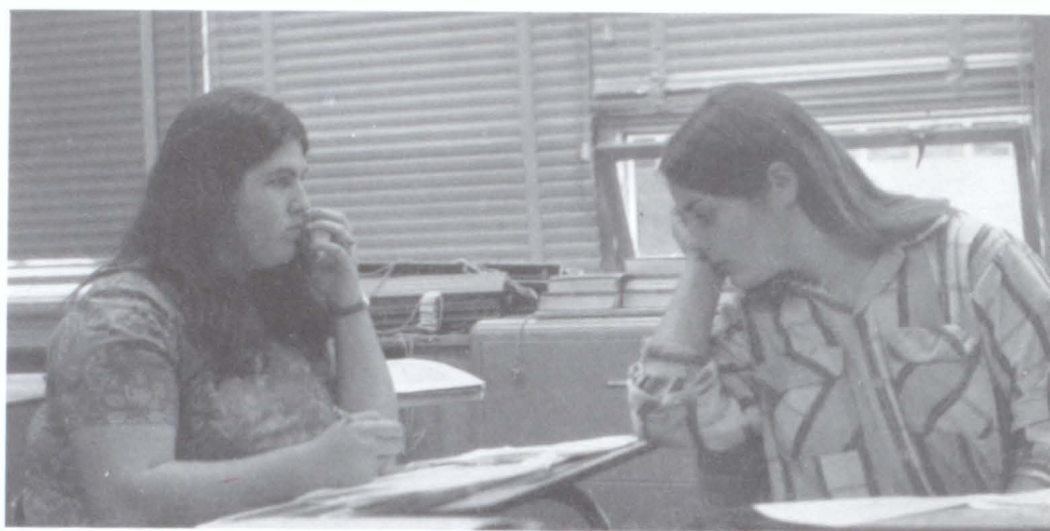

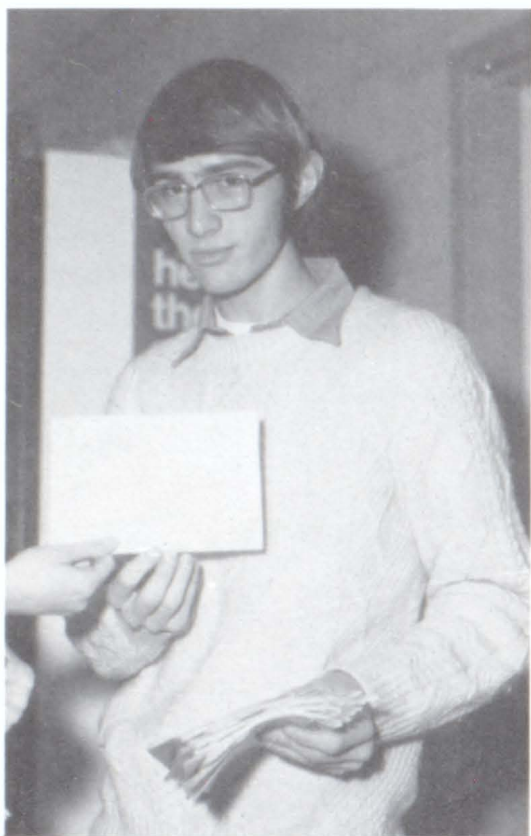

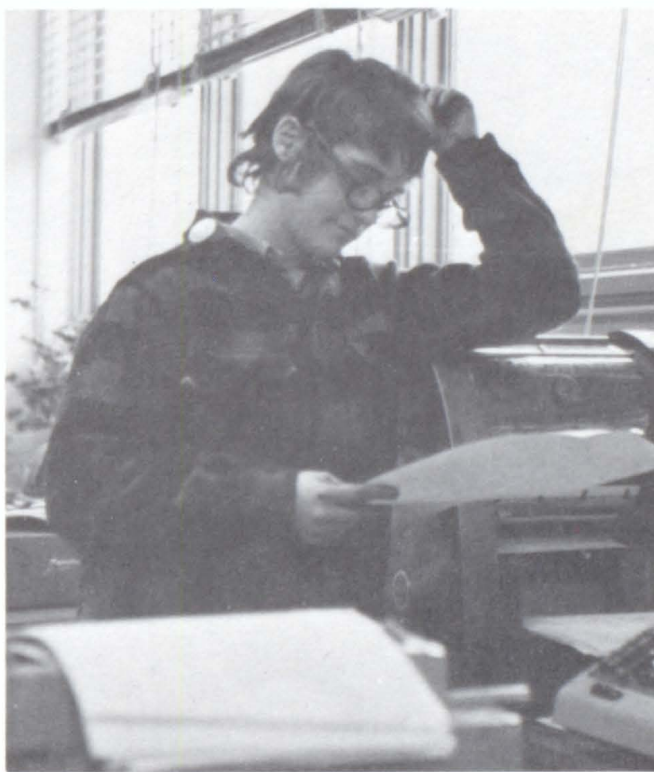

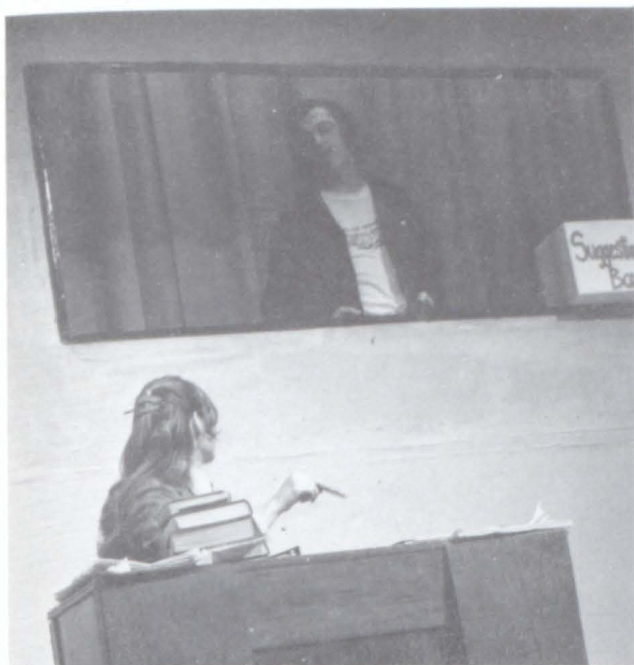

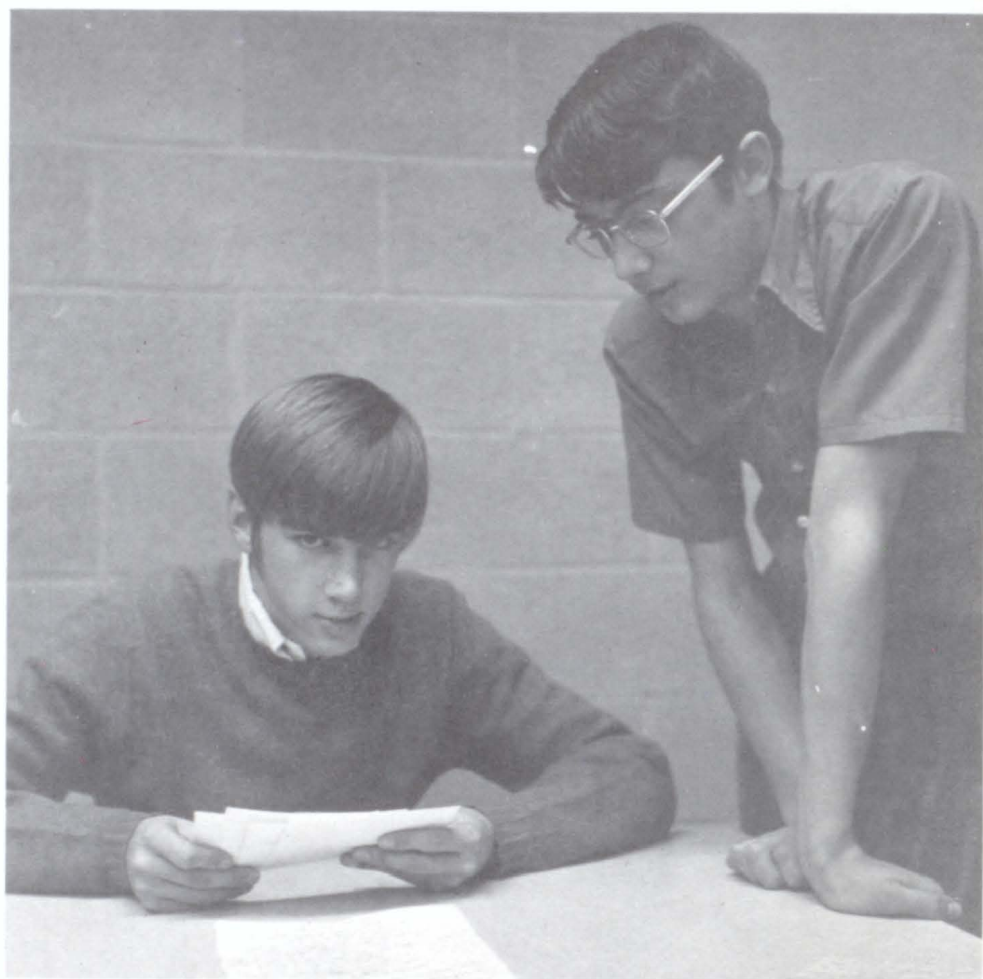

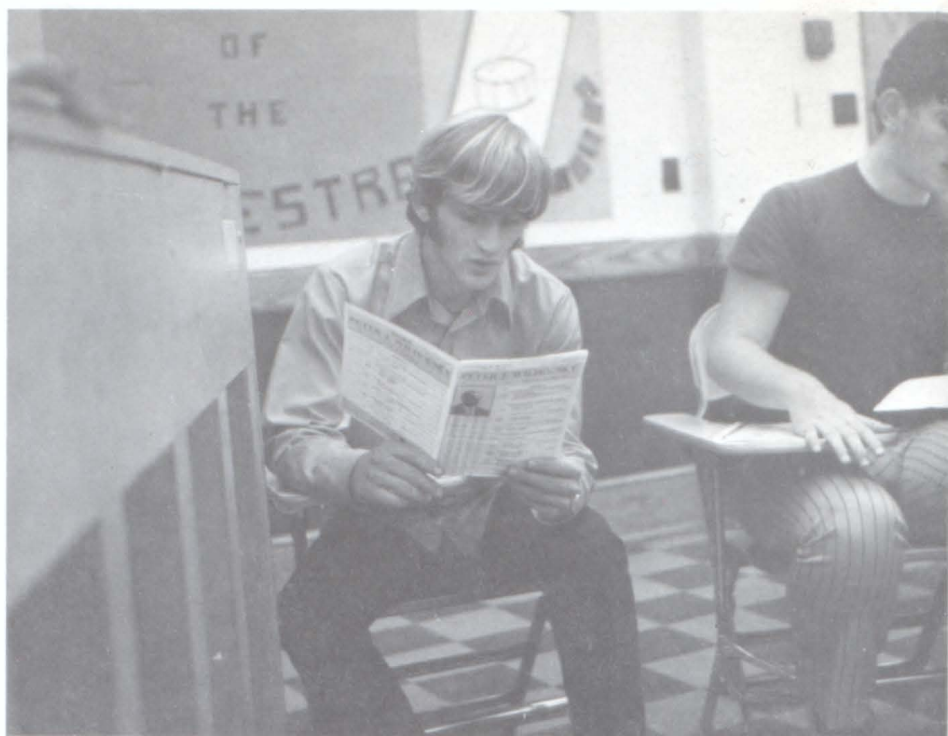


LIBRARY AIDES

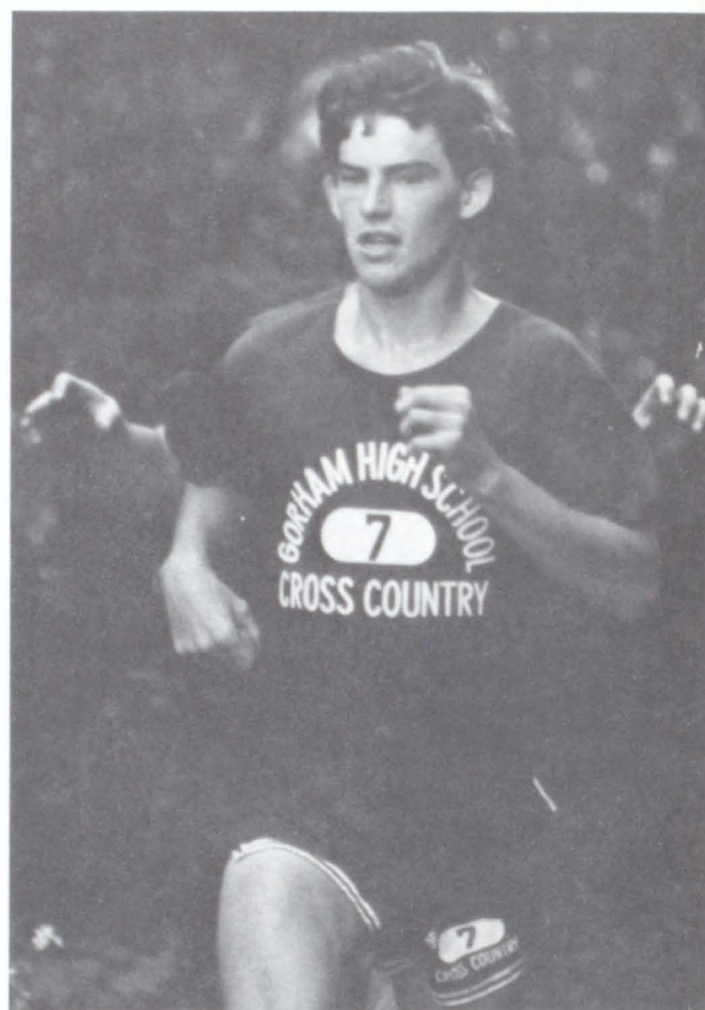
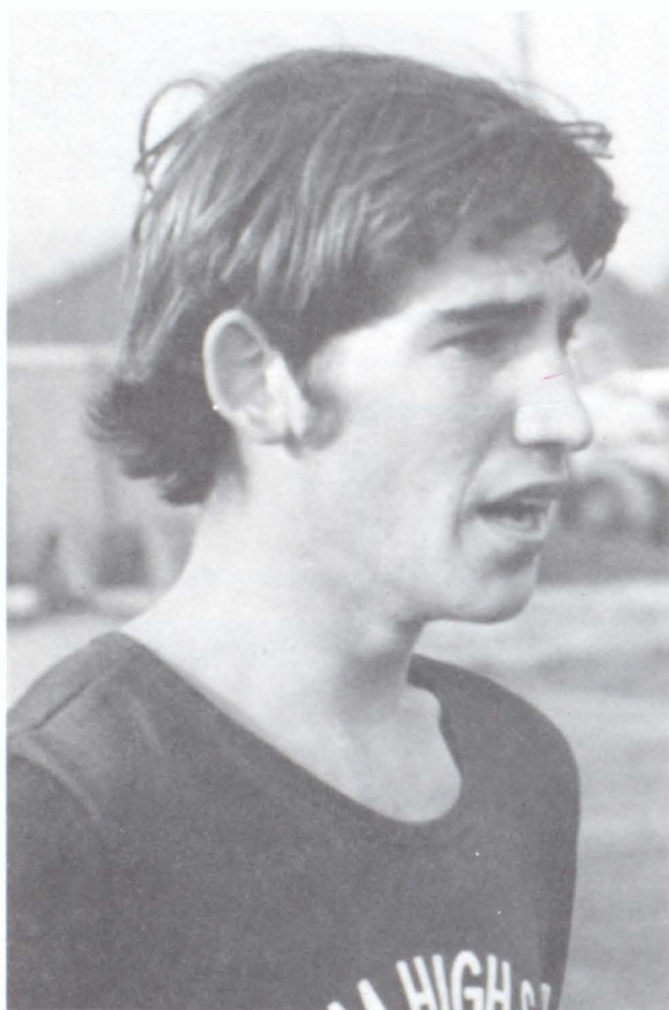




CROSS COUNTRY
