NEW ENGLAND SOCCER CHAMPS

Over the past three years, the Gorham High soccer team has established itself as a major soccer power in Maine and New England. The 1970 and 1971 Rams won the first two Maine State Championships, and the '71 team also became New England runners-up, losing only to New Bedford in the finals.

With just four starters returning, Gorham's 1972 campaign started gloomily with a 2-1 upset by a "fired-up" Greely team. However, the Ram's cool poise and Coach Stevenson's strict discipline combined for 13 straight wins and another chance to retain their state crown. Once again the Gorham booters traveled to Bowdoin College to face Fort Kent in a rematch of the previous years state final. Gorham made it three championships in a row, earning an exciting 3-2 victory.

The state champions returned to Bowdoin two weeks later seeking revenge for last year's loss in the New England finals. In the semi-final, on a snow covered field, Gorham showed its versatility by coming back with three straight goals to defeat Mt. Anthony Union High School of Vermont 3-1. The following day, Gorham faced Cathedral in quest of the championship. The Rams adjusted well to the snow and defeated Cathedral 2-0 in one of the finest displays of teamwork that Gorham High has ever exhibited.

Despite a loss of nine starters to graduation, next year's Rams will be expected to successfully defend Gorham's Maine and New England championship titles.

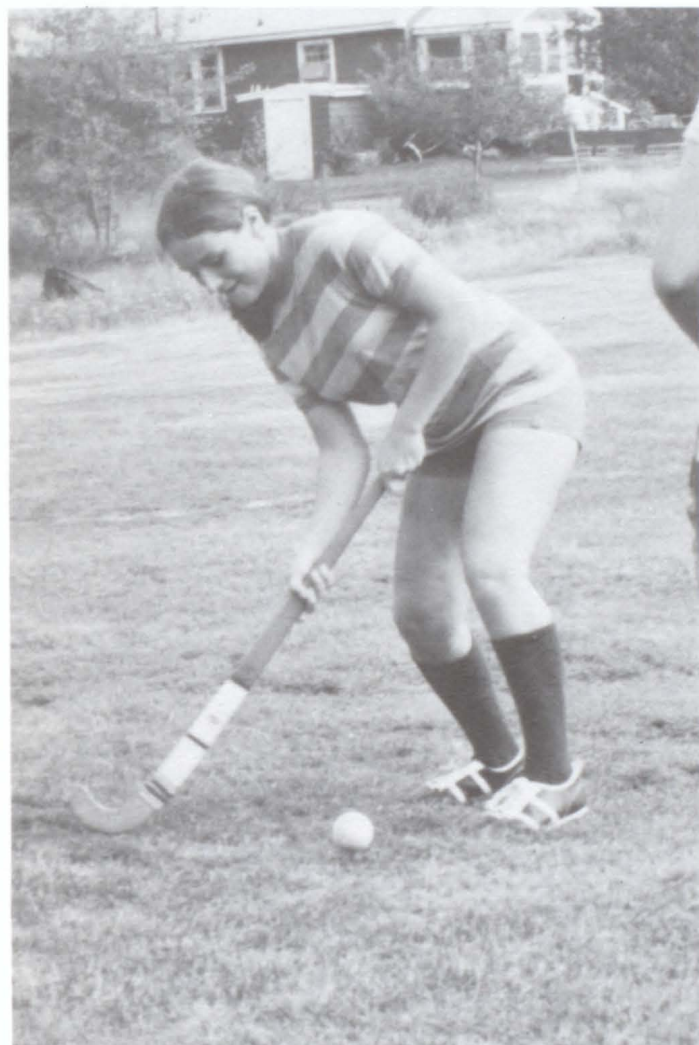
