


## THE SENIORS LEAVE . . .




# SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

The indispensable Mrs. Claire Drew, school nurse, dispenses aspirin, advice, and lots of sympathy to sick and ailing students. What would we do without her?


## THE GORHAM HIGH SCHOOL ENGLISH DEPARTMENT

### Philosophy:




The English Department is currently developing new senior elective offerings. A revised guided level program for freshmen through juniors is being developed.

Next year we are combining Civil Government and Economics into a Senior Seminar course and Geography will be added to the Freshman Seminar course.








Business


# HOME ECONOMICS


A percussion ensemble has been established and is practicing in the hope of presenting a concert sometime during the year.

## Madrigal Singers



## Resource Room

Mr. Schmidt has been teaching in the Resource Room since September of 1973. He has a Bachelor's degree in Speech Pathology and a Master's in Special Education. His experience includes teaching speech and remedial reading in St. Louis, Missouri for five years with two years as principal of the school where he began teaching. Mr. and Mrs. Schmidt came to Portland, Maine in 1971 where he was Director of Special Education, and she was a teacher at Portland High School.

The Gorham High School Resource Room offers a program in remedial reading to those students who have been found to experience difficulty in this area. After a thorough evaluation of each student's strengths and weaknesses, an individual program is created to enhance these strengths and reduce his weaknesses.

The Resource Room also provides an indirect service by supplying educational testing data to classroom teachers upon request. This service includes providing teachers with recommendations on how to deal with specific weaknesses within classroom settings.

Students are utilized to help the Resource Teacher carry out individualized programs as tutors.


# PHYSICAL EDUCATION DEPARTMENT



These students have got a lot of spirit, and the seniors, who have done so much this year, are going to be sorely missed next year.






"The What team?"
