


ADMINISTRATION



Mr. Grant, who is new to the faculty this year, received a Bachelor of Science degree from Tufts University and a Master of Science degree from University of Southern Maine.


Mrs. Benware, a graduate of Northampton Junior College, received a Bachelor of Science degree from University of Southern Maine. She joined the high school staff a year ago.

After attending Gorham High as a student, Mrs. Kneeland joined our staff in 1973 as secretary in the music department.



The student council has run a blood drive this year and is in charge of organizing the annual winter carnival. Other activities conducted by the student council are the rallies held for different athletic teams.



The student council is made up of the four officers who were elected in May and the president, vice-president, and student council representatives from each class.





The organization's major fund raising event is the annual carnation sale. Other fund raising events are the dance, and High School Quiz game.






CHORUS

The chorus performs at the Christmas and spring concerts. Many thanks go to Mr. Henry who devotes so much time and effort to put on such good performances.






COOKIE BOOTH STAFF
