





is never fully understood.


Your orange is so young and full

I never did get a chance to read the article or headlines. I presume it had a big picture of our soccer team celebrating and the headlines reading "SINCLAIR BRINGS TITLE SOUTH".

With misty eyes, I tried to walk off the field. I can not believe all of the attention I am receiving. Now a T.V. reporter would like to talk to me. As I was making my way through the crowd I was asked to describe the goal, "As soon as the ball was deflected to me I heard the coach shout 9 seconds. At that time I realized this was going to be the last shot of regulation time. I knew what I had to do so I did it."

When I got home it was about 6:00. Mom was hurrying me in the door, she didn't want me to miss my big goal or comment on T.V. As I sat down I looked around and there were all sorts of signs my mom had put up for me when I got home. As I was waiting for the big news clip, my dad sat down beside me and told me how well I played along with the rest of the team. My mom was in the kitchen cooking my favorite meal. John, my brother, was looking for his soccer ball so we could play after dinner. It was the first time I had felt our family united, I wish that moment could have lasted forever. As I was sitting there I decided this would be my first day and that from now on I would spend time with my brother also I would obey my parents. And year round we all were going to be happy as a family. Finally it came on it sent a chill up my spine. I glanced at the clock and realized I had better get ready for the states party.

As I hopped into the shower I realized if I was going to obey my parents from now on I couldn't drink and especially drink and drive. I figured this was a once in a life time thing so I made an agreement with myself that I could do anything I wanted tonight but tomorrow I would start a new life. As I was on my way out the door I gave my mom a big hug something I had never done before. I told John I would play with him tomorrow, and promised to help dad rake leaves and chop wood.

As I was pulling out of the driveway I was questioning which I'd rather do spend time with my family or party. I talked myself out of staying home because I would have from tomorrow on with my family. When I pulled up to the party it was already rocking. I walked up and people came running up to me handing me beers and congratulating me with hugs and kisses. About 2 hours later I was trashed, time went by quickly and it was time for the party to break up. I shouldn't have been driving but I'd done it before and had no problem so I figured I could do it again. When I got on the main road I had the truck going as fast as it could. Two miles down the road I went around a corner and some idiot was driving on the wrong side of the road. As I swerved I then realized I was the one on the wrong side of the road. It was too late; I had already gone through the guardrail and down over a steep hill.

I was pronounced dead at the scene. They took me into the hospital for an autopsy, the cause of the accident was a blood alcohol level of .21.

They say a prayer everynight for me. I'm glad they do but it makes me break down and cry everytime. I put a lot of pressure on my dad. Now he has to play the role of an older brother and parent.

School has changed, students have cut down the amount of partying considerably. Also just as a rule between them they do not let anyone that has been drinking drive. The other thing that has changed is the soccer team. I understand that this year's team is playing in memory of me. They wear maroon arm bands with a number 12 on it. My old uniform will not be worn again until John plays then after his senior year it will be retired and given to the family.

I wish I could be back with you at GHS. I know I will see all of you again, it will just be awhile though. Until that day I see you again I encourage you not to drink. If you must drink do yourself and me a favor and do not drive. Yes, I would like to see you again soon but you have a life to live and do not realize how lucky you are.

his voice whispers an evil cry.





I have two stories to tell you. The first is from a book by Dr. Seuss, author of such classics as *The Cat in the Hat* and *How the Grinch Stole Christmas*. Have you ever read *The Butter Battle Book*? It seems to be a simple children's book, but it's really much more. It has deep messages directed at all people. I'll introduce the story by reading the first few lines:

So, here we have two nations on opposite sides of the wall, the Zooks and the Yooks. The two nations are identical except in their philosophy about buttering bread. This disagreement on which side of the bread to butter leads to a great battle, a butter battle. Each nation has a staff of scientists inventing new and more devastating weapons until at last each nation makes the ultimate weapon, the big-boy boomerang, as Seuss calls it, capable of blowing the Zooks clear to Sala-ma-goo. This weapon, about the size of an egg, could totally devastate the enemy. A delegate from the Zooks is sent to the wall with one of these boomerangs, and a delegate from the Yooks, the narrator's grandfather, is sent to the wall, also carrying a boomerang. And at the end of the story, both stand on the wall holding this little bomb, ready to drop it on the other side.

"Grandpa!" I shouted. "Be careful! Oh, Gee!

Who's going to drop it?

Will you ...? Or will he ...?"

"Be patient," said Grandpa. "We'll see.

We will see ..."

The second story I have to tell was in a recent movie, which I'm sure a lot of you saw, *War Games*. It tells of a boy who taps into a government computer and plays a game called Global thermo-nuclear war, but the guys in Washington don't realize it's a game. They think that the Russians are attacking. The boy eventually realizes what's going on and tries to stop the game, but the computer continues playing. The game does eventually end before the world is blown up. The computer analyzes the game Global thermo-nuclear war and predicts the outcome of every possible situation. It would predict what Russia would do under every possible circumstance and what the United States would do under every possible circumstance, and the computer concluded of the game global thermo nuclear war and I quote "A very interesting game, the only way to win such a game is to not play at all."

The two stories combined make a very important statement. The first story tells of what wars are fought for. Is it worth it to sacrifice millions of lives in order that every one will butter their bread in a certain way. We can do it. We can make a difference. The two stories I told you are very recent, but the idea goes back thousands of years. I'd like to end with a quote from Isaiah in the Bible:


They shall beat their swords into plowshares,
